Cleaning areas

If you're the type who drives a 'big' rig then you're probably aware that smoke and foul odor can take a toll on your resale value. And that's not the only way they can affect your oh-so-fun cruising pleasure. Using the right cleaning products can help you keep your ride looking like new. Luckily, it's not hard to find the ingredients. A quick search on the internet will turn up a plethora of products that can help your vehicle perform better than it did when you first bought it. The key is to learn which products work best for you.

While a lot of manufacturers have their own proprietary solutions, there are a couple of off-the-shelf juggernauts that can make your life a bit less painful. For example, a steam cleaner will clean the rubber, fabric and vinyl mats as well as upholstery and carpeting. You can even get a microfiber cloth that will scrub out stains and debris in your windshield. Similarly, a good leather conditioner will make your seats last longer and your car smokin' like new. Lastly, a good vacuum will also remove unwanted debris from your ride. All of this can be done in under an hour, so there's no reason to wait.

Replacing air filters

If you are experiencing smoke and foul odor smells in your car, you might want to consider replacing the air filter. These filters can be purchased at auto parts stores for under \$20. They are also fairly easy to replace.

Smoke and foul odor smells can come from a number of sources. Among these are rodent droppings, leaks, spilled food and drink, and exhaust fumes.

One of the most difficult odors to remove is cigarette smoke. Smoke leaves behind a tarry residue, which can make removing the odor a difficult process. Fortunately, you can use some basic home remedies to get rid of this unpleasant smell.

Once the interior is cleaned, you can spray the air intake system with an odor neutralizer. This can help remove the cigarette odor from the car. Some of these products can be purchased at auto parts stores for under \$30.

Another way to remove cigarette odor is to plug a small air filter into the cigarette outlet. Alternatively, you can run your car's air conditioner full blast to eliminate tarry cigarette residue.

Biological fluids, such as urine, can also be a cause of a lingering odor. Although they aren't the most common odors in a car, they can be dangerous. So, you might need to call a professional if these problems persist.

Cleaning the air filters can also be a great help in removing a cigarette smell. Cabin air filters can be accessed through your glove box. Most vehicles have pull-away plastic tabs that allow you to easily remove them.

If a new cabin air filter doesn't solve the problem, you may need to contact an auto repair technician to fix the issue. A faulty air filter can pump the smoke and foul odor smell back into the cabin.

It's best to check on your car's cabin air filters once every 30,000 miles. Dirt and dust can collect on them and cause them to become clogged.

Steam cleaning the engine

Steam cleaning the engine is a good way to remove unpleasant odors from your car. It can also help to clean out some built up dirt and oil.

Another odor-fighting method is to spray an aerosol disinfectant into the plenum box. These products also help to dislodge stale air from your vents.

While you are at it, consider getting an all-natural air freshener. Activated charcoal is an excellent choice as it can absorb odors with ease. Additionally, make sure to change the activated charcoal periodically.

If you don't want to spend a lot of money on a professional cleaner, you can easily make your own engine cleaner. A mixture of baking soda and essential oils can work well. Make sure to clean it out with a microfiber cloth afterwards.

There are plenty of other methods for removing odors. Besides steam cleaning, you could try a simple baking soda and water solution. Or, you can hire a professional to perform the necessary scrubbing.

Whatever you do, don't forget to fold the rear bench forward. This will enable you to access the wheel well and fender liners. That's where a lot of unpleasant smells tend to end up.

Using a combination of hot water and a vinegar solution can be an easy way to rid your car of an odor. This is especially true if you don't mind exposing yourself to the risk of harsh chemicals.

Regardless of whether you choose to go with steam cleaning or a more natural approach, the most important thing to remember is that an unpleasant odor is not a good idea.

Citrus peels

Aside from the citrus peels mentioned above, you can also try using activated charcoal to remove odors. It's not as absorbent as other solutions, but it will help to neutralize the airborne odors.
